

Dear Parents,

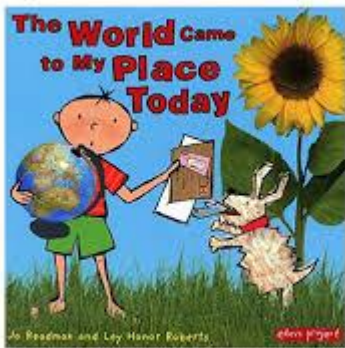
We hope you are all still keeping well and safe. Thank you once again for the wonderful range of work posted last week. We had some absolutely fantastic fruit kebab pictures!

This week, as part of our theme work, we will be continuing to focus on food and where these come from.

- Retell the story using pictures.
- Try naming all of the different foods in the story and pictures.
- Can you make a list all of the different places mentioned in the story?
- Can you show where these places are on a world map?
- What comes from each place? Can you draw a picture of the food or item on a world map?
- Find out where other foods you eat come from and add them to your world map.
- Write a book review for the story and post it to us on Seesaw.

We will be posting suggestions for activities you might like to do, but please do what is manageable for you at home. These will be based on what we are covering in school with the children.
